Our Values are:

We are a part of a Tri-Campus including Dr. Elliott and Acme Schools. We plan activities and make connections between students and staff in our Tri-Campus.

Although we have class configurations that are triple and even quadruple graded for certain subjects, we thrive to have home room settings of two combined grades.

Staff members are dedicated to creating innovative and engaging learning activities that are multileveled and differentiated. An example of this is a combined grade 3-6 Daily Five Language Arts program that has each student working at their own level. Junior High students have Wonder Wednesdays where they choose a passion to pursue and are given time and resources to support their learning.

Although our enrollment is low, we acknowledge that it is taxing to handle multiple curricula in a single classroom. We cycle courses where possible in order to allow for dedicated instruction of a single curriculum in a combined classroom.

We work with our Parent Advisory Council to initiate and support programming that provide support for academic and social programs as well as extra curricular and fine arts. We connect with community groups and businesses to provide opportunities for students.

#### Student Learning Engagement – Measure Details

Although we may not have the elective courses found in other schools, we do provide unique learning opportunities for our students. Teachers are creative and innovative in facilitating and supporting learning though varied educational experiences.

We use outside sources such as theatre residencies to support learning in the arts. In February 2022, Trickster Theatre will work with every student at Carbon School to create a drama production with the theme of Roots and Wings. Students will study the history of Carbon and create skits that represent our history, our present and what we would like Carbon to look like in the future. We will be partnering with local groups(Carbon and Area Restoration Society) and citizens to support this effort. This type of programming is supported financially through grants and funds from our Parent Advisory Council.

Our plan to use all venues and expertise in the three communities in our tri-campus will also provide connection and unique learning opportunities for our students. Activities will include archery, curling, pottery, and visits to local businesses. Our Parent Advisory Council is also reaching out to parents and staff to find local programs and areas of expertise that could be accessed for opportunities for students.

An up and down trend has been noted in this area over the past few years, especially with student results.



#### **Education Quality – Measure Details**




Although our results for this section are a bit lower than the jurisdiction and the province, we acknowledge that overall stakeholders are happy with the quality of education at Carbon School.

Due to multi-graded class configurations, teachers are constantly working toward not only finding engaging activities to teach curricula, but differentiating in a way that accommodates all learners in that setting. A brilliant example of this is in a grade 3-6 Daily Five program for English Language Arts. Each student is given material at their level and outcomes in both reading and writing are tackled. This takes a great deal of organization by the teacher, but as the structure and routines are practiced, students know exactly what they are to work on at any given time. This creative approach to ELA not only teaches the curricular outcomes, but it also provides opportunities for connection among students.


We use outsourced resources often for programming in drama, art and technology. These are often considered "oneoffs", but they still provide quality learning experiences for our students.



We have noticed a significant drop in this parameter since 2017. This may be due in part to a staffing cut that took place two years ago.


The results for students in grades 7-9 were particularly low in this section. A deliberate focus on promoting positive school culture and providing unique and creative learning opportunities for our students is a must.
